AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT FOR THE EXTENSION OF A WATER MAIN

Whereas, the attached agreement for the extension of a water main and for provision of water service is in the best interests of the Village of Chatham;

Therefore, be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Chatham, Illinois, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The agreement between the Village of Chatham and certain water customers, whose names and signatures appear on the attached agreement, is hereby approved.

<u>Section 2</u>. The president is authorized to sign the agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit A.

CONTRACT FOR WATER AND WATER MAIN EXTENSION CHATHAM, ILLINOIS

This Agreement, made this 6TH day of JUNE 1989, by and between the VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, ILLINOIS, a municipal corporation, (hereafter called the VILLAGE), and the persons whose names and signatures appear at the signatory spaces at the end of this Agreement, (hereafter called the CUSTOMERS), WITNESSES THAT:

For and in consideration of the mutual covenants and undertakings made herein, the VILLAGE and CUSTOMERS covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. Auby, Oglesby and Bartolomucci, Registered
 Professional Engineers and Surveyors, agree to sponsor and
 supervise the construction of approximately 8,375 linear feet
 of 6 inch water main to be extended from the I-55 Frontage
 Road at the Southeast corner of the Northeast Quarter
 Southeast Quarter of Section 16, Township 14 North, Range 5
 West of the third Principal Meridian, Sangamon County,
 Illinois, and identified as Mains A-1, A-2, A-3 and Main B as
 shown by plat prepared by said Registered Professional
 Engineers and Surveyors, attached hereto and made a part
 hereof.
- 2. CUSTOMERS agree to employ George Lindsay to perform the construction work as soon as reasonably possible after the funds are deposited (as hereinafter provided) and receipt of the necessary easements, together with an executed copy hereof; to make all necessary connections and tests in the

mains, and to complete the work as rapidly as reasonably possible.

- 3. Except for Main A-2 which will be paid for by Thomas Bartolomucci and William Schnirring, and for Main A-3 which will be paid for by Don and Henrietta Hashman (but which mains will become public property), CUSTOMERS agree, for the benefit of the VILLAGE, to pay the entire cost of the labor and materials in such amount per customer as results from dividing the actual cost by the number of Customers; except that the VILLAGE will replace a 4-inch water main with a 6-inch main and hydrant in the North 800 feet of Main B. Progress payments of 90% of work completed will be paid upon receipt of lien releases, with final payment when the work is certified completed to the VILLAGE's approval.
- 4. CUSTOMERS agree that the laying and extension of said water main is for the special benefit of CUSTOMERS, and no refund or rebate except as may herein be provided for specifically shall hereafter be made by the VILLAGE.
- 5. CUSTOMERS agree that said extended water mains shall become the property of and subject to the control and maintenance of the VILLAGE as a part of its water distribution system.
- 6. VILLAGE AND CUSTOMERS both covenant and agree that the VILLAGE will not permit any other firm, person or corporation to tap onto said extended main (except for the aforesaid 800 feet in Main B for which the VILLAGE will

receive 120% of the actual amount paid by CUSTOMERS for Mains Λ -1, Λ -2 and Λ -3 as a condition of participating in this water main project) to supply water to any property unless CUSTOMERS have approved and have received from each new user 120% of the actual amount which each Customer pays in order to participate, which funds will be deposited in a special Account in the Chatham Community Bank under the name of Neighborhood Water Main Project Account, the terms of which account are more fully set forth in paragraphs 7, 8 and 9 below, until all CUSTOMERS have received a return of all of their original deposits, or until 20 years from the date hereof, whichever first occurs. Thereafter, the VILLAGE may grant tap permits without payment to CUSTOMERS.

7. Each owner of property to be served by this water main who signs this agreement shall immediately pay his actual participation cost into the aforesaid Special Account before construction starts. Disbursements from said account shall be made on the written direction of the President and Treasurer of the Neighborhood Water Main Association, and the Bank shall have no obligation to see that the work has been accomplished or the necessary lien waivers obtained. If there are funds remaining after all bills are paid, they will be disbursed equally to the CUSTOMERS, after retaining such minimum amount as will keep the account open. If there are insufficient funds to pay all expenses, each CUSTOMER will pay his equal share of the shortage into the account. As

payments are made into the account by new owners, they will be distributed equally to all CUSTOMERS. When all CUSTOMERS have had their contributions repaid, or after 20 years, whichever first occurs, the account will be closed.

- 8. Any future main extensions shall be at the owner's expense if the cost per tap equals or exceeds 120% of the final cost to each CUSTOMER. If the cost is less than 120% of the CUSTOMER'S final cost, the difference will be paid to the Association for distribution to the original CUSTOMERS.
- 9. CUSTOMERS agree that all easements for this project as shown on the attached plat are hereby granted by the respective property owners by their execution of this Agreement.
- 10. The CUSTOMERS shall constitute a voluntary unincorporated Association with such constitution and by-laws as they may adopt or amend from time to time, except that no such governing rules may limit the VILLAGE's rights or obligations hereunder.
- 11. In the event that a CUSTOMER sells his property, such CUSTOMER may, by written instrument acknowledged by the Buyer, retain the right to receive the remainder of his contribution, provided that a copy of such writing is delivered to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Association. In the absence of such written document, the new owner will be entitled to receive the remainder of the CUSTOMER's original contribution.

- 12. CUSTOMERS and VILLAGE agree that the covenants herein contained are the essence of this Agreement, and, except as otherwise provided herein, shall be for the benefit of and binding upon the parties hereto, their heirs and assigns.
- 13. The use of the singular masculine pronoun is for convenience only, and includes the feminine and plural when the context so requires.

The following items have been made part of ORDINANCE NO. 89-22 by the Village Board of Trustees at their June 6, 1989 meeting.

- ITEM 14: The minutes of the Sewer and Water Committee of May 30, 1989 shall be made part of the ordinance. Special attention to be given to the additional valve to be added.
- ITEM 15: The contract between Neighborhood Water Main Project and George Lindsay shall be attached. Note one year waintenance.
- ITEM 16: The names of Henry and Louise Fishwick, and Levawn Rentsch shall be removed from the association due to the main not being in front of their property at this time, and CWIP will not allow a 1200 foot service.
- ITEM 17: Easements shall be obtained from Bartolomucci and Hashman, since part of the main is on private property. Easements shall "no fault" statements in them, Village not responsible for crop damages.

George Lindsay has installed the main for the Neighborhood Water Main Association. The north end is marked with a 2x4 board in the trench.

The only valves that have been installed to date are at the fire hydrants; the beginning of the 6" main at the 12" main, and the south end. The village would like a 6" valve at the junction of northline and eastwest line by Copp property. The association will install this one valve. The north valve will be Village of Chatham's responsibility.

All services will be 3/4" meters, some owners have ran a 2" plastic line to cut down on friction lost.

The association has a one year maintenance agreement with Mr. George Lindsay that covers their section of water main, services, driveways, culverts, etc.

The village will get a permit from Ball Township to cover the entire main. The association will get written easements from property owners for all of their mains, including the one across Hashman's field.

Water rates will be the same as Chatham has for outside the village customers. This rate will be reviewed and may be adjusted. The village needs to look at bond conditions for water and sewer.

The association gave the committee a contract to present to the village board. The committee would like to have items reviewed and/or added:

- The village will deal with the treasurer of association only.
- 2. Twenty year term will remain in the contract.
- 3. Village attorney will review the 120% fee for north end owners where there is a 4" existing main.

- 4. Association will give the village a final construction cost and this is the amount that 120% fees will go against until the total construction cost has been reimbursed by the association without interest.
- 5. One year contract with George Lindsay will be added to contract.
- 6. Easements will be obtained by association.

Conclusion of meeting:

Village will act on contract at a June 6, 1989 meeting. If approved, village will begin installing 6" main as soon as possible. The association will update contract. The proposed south extension (4900' ±) will be reviewed after CWLP flow test the north main. The village will require approval from association before any tap is allowed, and additional tap fee (Chathams standard fee) will be charged for all new taps. The village will update the property owners list for CWLP approval of ALL outside water customers.

Meeting with association adjourned at 9:05 p.m.

One voice vote - Motion to leave 20 year term in contract. Loving, yes; Williamsen, yes; Burke, yes.

Also covered was:

- A Approval given to have two fire hydrants installed along West Walnut off 8" main; one off East Walnut at Baptist Church 12" main, and one at Chestnut and Ash
- B Map has been prepared showing flows of fire hydrants, several areas need review to see if loops can be connected to increase flows.
- C 10" water main to run down Chestnut and College, to be done by village crews. Connections and upgrade of sideroad mains to be done later.
