Ordinance No. 93-35

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A PREVAILING WAGE FOR THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act Regulating Wages of Laborers, Mechanics, and Other Workers Employed in Any Public Works by the State, County, City or Any Public Body or Any Political Subdivision or by Anyone Under Contract for Public Works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended (Ill.Rev.Stat., 1991, Ch. 48, par. 39s-1, et seq.) (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the Village of Chatham,
Sangamon County, Illinois, investigate and ascertain the prevailing
rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics, and
other workers in the locality of said Village of Chatham, Sangamon
County, Illinois, employed in performing construction of public
works, for said Village of Chatham, Sangamon County, Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, SANGAMON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by the Act, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics, and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Chatham, Sangamon County, Illinois, is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the Sangamon County area as of June, 1993, as determined by the Department of Labor, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the Act shall be

the same as in the Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village of Chatham, Illinois, to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 3: The Clerk of the Village of Chatham, Illinois, shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the Village of Chatham, Sangamon County, Illinois, this determination or any revisions of the prevailing rate of wages. A copy of this determination or of any revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The Clerk of the Village of Chatham, Illinois, shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Clerk of the Village of Chatham, Illinois, shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Secretary of State Index Division.

SECTION 6: The Clerk of the Village of Chatham, Illinois, shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a notice in the form of Exhibit "B" hereto that this determination of this public body is effective.

SANGAMON COUNTY

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply:

New Years Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

- Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehousemen, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or men to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.
- Class 2. Two or three axls trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axls combination units, and ticket writers.
- Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, mechanics and working foremen, and dispatchers.

Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

- Class 1. Asphalt Screed Man; Aspco Concrete Spreaders; Asphalt Pavers; Asphalt Plant Engineer; Asphalt Rollers on Bituminous Concrete; Athey Loaders; Backfillers, Crane Type; Backhoes, Barber Green Loaders; Bulldozers; Cableways; Cherry Pickers; Clam Shells; C.M.I. & similar type-autograde formless paver, autograde placer & finisher; Concrete Breakers; Concrete Plant Operators; Concrete Pumps; Cranes; Derricks; Derrick Boats; Dewatering Systems; Draglines; Earth Auger or Boring Machines; Elevating Graders; Engineers on Dredges; Gravel Processing Machines; Bead Equipment Greaser; High Lifts or Fork Lifts; Hoists with two or more drums or two or more load lines; Locomotives, All; Mechanics; Motor Graders or Auto Patrols; Operators or Leverman on Dredges; Operators, ower Boat; Operators, Pug Mill (Asphalt Plants); Crange Peels; Overhead Cranes; Paving Mixers; Piledrivers; Pipe Wrapping and Painting Machines; Pushdozers, or Push Cats; Rock Crushers; Ross Carriers or Similar Machines; Scoops, Skimmer, two cu. yd. capacity and under; Sheep-Foot Roller (Self-Propelled); Shovels; Skimmer Scoops; Test Hole Drilling Machines; Tower Cranes; Tower Machines; Tower Mixers; Track Type End Loaders; Track Type Fork Lifts or High Lifts; Track Jacks and Tampers; Tractors, Sideboom; Trenching or Ditching Machine; Tunnelluggers; Vermeer Type Saws; Wheel Type End Loaders; Winch Cat; Scoops, All or Tournapull.
- Class 2. Air compressors (six to eight); Asphalt Boosters and Heaters; Asphalt Distributors, Asphalt Plant Fireman, Oiler on Two Paving Mixers when used in Tandem; Boom or Winch Trucks; Building Elevators; Bull Floats or Flexplanes; Concrete Finishing Machine; Concrete Saws, Self-Propelled; Concrete Spreading Machines; Gravel or Stone Spreader, Power Operated; Hoist, Automatic; Hoist with One Drum and One Load Line; Mud Jacks; Post Hole Digger, Machanical; Road or Street Sweeper, Self-Propelled; Seaman Tiller; Straw Machine; Vibratory Compactor; Well Drill Machines; Scissors Hoist.
- Class 3. Air Compressors, (one to five); Air Compressors, Track or Self-Propelled; Bulk Cement Batching Plants; Conveyors; Concrete Mixers (Except Plant, Paver, or Tower); Firemen; Generators; Greasers; Belper on Single Paving Mixer; Light Plants; Mechanic Helpers; Mechanical Heaters; Oilers; Power Form Graders; Power Sub-Graders; Tractors without power attachments regardless of size or type; Truck Crane Oiler and Driver; Vibratory Hammer (power source); Water Pumps; Welding Machines (one/300 Amp. or over); Welding Machines, (one to five).

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If there is no such definition on file, the Eureau of Labor Statistics SIC list will be used. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. Further, if no such neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217/782/1710 for wage rates or clarifications.
