EMPLOYEEMNET AND SALARY


WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Chatham have determined that it is in the best interest of the Village to maintain a well trained, professional work force, and the pay for professional staff who serve the Village must be commensurate with surrounding and competing work force to assist in providing a stable force of trained professionals.

WHEREAS, the Administrative Committee is recommending the following salary for Sherry Dierking as she moves from a schedule of 30 hours per week to 40 hours per week.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, SANGAMON COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Sherry Dierking shall be paid \$2,526.05 bi-weekly to be divided equally between the Electric, General and Water Funds effective January 1, 2008.

Section 2: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon passage and approval.
