## Governor Signs Minimum Wage Increase

On Dec. 18, Gov. Blagojevich signed into law legislation increasing the state minimum wage to $\$ 7.50$ per hour on July 1, 2007. The minimum wage will increase by an additional 25 cents in each of the following three years to $\$ 7.75$ on July 1, 2008; $\$ 8.00$ on July 1, 2009; and $\$ 8.25$ on July 1, 2010.

# Illinois' New Minimum Wage \$7.75 July 1, 2008 - June 30, 2009 

The minimum wage will increase by another 25 cents each July $1^{\text {st }}$ for the next two years (in $2009 \& 2010$ )

- New employees (first 90 days of employment) and employees under age 18 may be paid up to 50 cents less per hour.
- Tipped employees may be paid $60 \%$ of the hourly minimum wage ( $\$ 4.65$ through June 30, 2009).
- Certain employees must be paid overtime, at time and one-half of the regular rate, after 40 hours of work in a workweek.
