

ORDINANCE # 08 - 21

AN ORDINANCE IN REFERENCE TO SALARIES OF VILLAGE EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, the following named persons are to be employed by the Village of Chatham at the salary rates herein provided:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, SANGAMON COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That the following named persons shall be paid from the respective funds in the amounts herein provided:

Governor Signs Minimum Wage Increase

On Dec. 18, Gov. Blagojevich signed into law legislation increasing the state minimum wage to \$7.50 per hour on July 1, 2007. The minimum wage will increase by an additional 25 cents in each of the following three years to \$7.75 on July 1, 2008; \$8.00 on July 1, 2009; and \$8.25 on July 1, 2010.

Illinois' New Minimum Wage

\$7.75 per hour

July 1, 2008 – June 30, 2009

- The minimum wage will increase by another 25 cents each July 1st for the next two years (in 2009 & 2010)
- New employees (first 90 days of employment) and employees under age 18 may be paid up to 50 cents less per hour.
- Tipped employees may be paid 60% of the hourly minimum wage (\$4.65 through June 30, 2009).
- Certain employees must be paid overtime, at time and one-half of the regular rate, after 40 hours of work in a workweek.
