WHEREAS, the Village of Chatham sought and obtained bids for Roll-off Containers for use during the Village's Annual Cleanup program October 10<sup>th</sup> and October 17<sup>th</sup> ; and


WHEREAS, the attached bids were opened September 15, 2009 at 8:00 a.m. and the lowest responsible bidder identified; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That the bid from Allied Waste for \$350.00 per loaded 30 yard container, up to five tons with an additional charge of \$40 per ton above five tons, and no charge for Scrap Metal Container. No air conditioners, rail road ties, yard waste, liquids of any type, tires, batteries or hazardous material.
