Ordinance No. 11- 50

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ANIMAL AND ZONING CHAPTERS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Section 90.03(D) of the Village Code of Ordinances is amended to

state as follows (deleted language stricken, new language underlined):

(D) Except as specifically permitted by the Zoning Chapter of this Code. Subject to the village zoning ordinance, the keeping or harboring of any wild animal or fowl, horses, asses, mules, cattle, swine, sheep, goats (including pygmy goats), geese, ducks, poultry (including but not limited to chickens, ducks, geese, pheasants, peacocks, quail and turkeys, and whether kept for eggs. as pets or otherwise) rodents (except hamsters, guinea pigs, mice, and other rodents commonly kept as pets), or and livestock (including but not limited to swine, sheep, cattle, ponies, goats, horses, asses and mules, and including such animals kept as pets)chickens within the corporate limits of the village is prohibited and is hereby declared a nuisance. However, the keeping or harboring of female pygmy goats under 40 pounds in weight, and juvenile or eastrated male adult pygmy goats under 50 pounds in weight is not prohibited, so long as there are no more than two such goats per platted lot, and the goats are kept as pets.

SECTION 2: The definition of "Agriculture" in Section 158.004 of the Code of

Ordinances of the Village of Chatham is amended to state as follows (deleted language stricken,

new language <u>underlined</u>):

AGRICULTURE. The growing, harvesting and storing of crops, including but not limited to legume, hay, grain, fruit and truck or vegetable crops, floriculture, horticulture, mushroom growing, nurseries, orchards, forestry and greenhouses; the keeping, raising and feeding of <u>poultry (including but not limited to chickens, ducks, geese, pheasants, peacocks, quail and turkeys, and whether kept for eggs, as pets or otherwise)</u> livestock (including but not limited to, <u>poultry</u>, swine, sheep, <u>beef</u> cattle, ponies, goats, <u>other than pygmy goats kept as pets</u>) and horses, <u>asses and mules, and including such animals kept as pets</u>); bees, fur farms, and fish and wildlife farms; farm buildings used for growing, harvesting and preparing crop products for market, for agricultural products, farm buildings for storing and protecting farm machinery and equipment from the elements, for housing livestock or poultry products for market; farm dwellings occupied by farm owners, operators, tenants or farm workers.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance is effective upon its passage and publication as

required by law. The Clerk shall publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form and shall see to its inclusion in the next update of the Village Code of Ordinances.
