

Be it resolved by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Chatham, Illinois, that the following notice to contractors be and the same is hereby approved, and Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause publication of the same in The Auburn Citizen in the issues of December 15th, December 22nd, and December 29th, 1933, respectively.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.
VILLAGE OF CHATHAM, ILLINOIS.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Village of Chatham, Sangamon County, Illinois, until 2:00 P. M., on the sixth (6) day of January, A.

1934, at the Village Board Chambers in said Village, at which time they will be publicly opened according to law, for the construction of a complete waterworks system consisting of force main, distribution system, service connections, elevated tank, and all appurtenances thereto complete, all in accordance with an Ordinance entitled,

An ordinance authorizing and providing for the issue of \$65,000 Water Revenue Bonds for the Village of Chatham, Sangamon County, Illinois, for the purpose of defraying the cost of constructing a complete waterworks system for said Village, prescribing all the details of said bonds, and providing for the collection, segregation and distribution of the revenue of the waterworks system of said Village for the purpose of paying the costs of the operation and maintenance thereof, providing adequate depreciation fund therefor, and paying the principal and interest of said water revenue bonds and plans and specifications now on file in the office of the village clerk and prepared by the Caldwell Engineering Company of Jacksonville, Illinois, and in accordance with all of the rules and regulations set out by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, and particularly those regulations set out in Bulletin No. 2.

Each bid or proposal must be accompanied by a bank draft drawn on New York, Chicago, or St. Louis, in an amount equal to ten percentum (10%) of the aggregate bid or proposal.

Proposals shall be submitted for the whole complete system, and the award will be made in one single award in accordance with the law.

The minimum wage scale on this project shall be as follows:

UNSKILLED LABOR-----50¢ per hour.
SKILLED LABOR-----\$1.20 per hour.

The employment of all labor shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations aforesaid of the Federal Emergency Administration

of Public works.

The successful bidder will be required to enter into a formal written contract in accordance with the terms of the proposal, notice to contractors, instructions to bidders, and the plans and specifications aforesaid, and to furnish an approved and satisfactory surety bonds, said bond to be in an amount equal to the full amount of the proposal, and guaranteeing to protect the Village from all damages, including the paying of all valid mechanics liens, and commence the performance of his contract within ten days from the date of the acceptance and approval of the award by the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.

Payment for this work will be made in cash by the village of Chatham from funds obtained from the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works. The water project has been submitted to and formally approved by the said Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, and it is contemplated that the village of Chatham will enter into a formal bond purchase contract with the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works to secure the funds to pay for the construction of this project.

The village of Chatham, or the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works expects to obtain the professional, financial and ethical history record of all contractors bidding on this work from the Bureau of Contract Information, Inc., 729 Fifteenth Street Northwest, Washington, D. C. If any contractor bidding on this work does not already have his history record filed with that organization, he should write them immediately requesting questionnaire, fill it out and return it at once.

Each bidder shall furnish the Village with satisfactory evidence of his competency to perform the work contemplated. Not later than ten (10) Days prior to the opening of bids he shall file with the village clerk a financial statement of his business as of July 1st, 1933, prepared by a public accountant, and submitted on forms furnished by the village; each bidder shall file with village clerk on forms furnished by the village and not later than ten (10) Days prior to the date of opening bids, a sworn experience questionnaire.

No proposal blanks will be issued to any contractor who has not filed a financial statement and an experience questionnaire as outlined above.

The village reserves the right to reject any or all bids, waive informality in bids received, and to contract with whomsoever it deems

most favorable to the village of Chatham, Illinois.

Plans and specifications are on file for inspection in the office of the village clerk, and the Caldwell Engineering Company, Jacksonville, Illinois.
